AIM: To show the children that God has a plan for each one of us. We, therefore, need to obey

Him.

## **Content:**

A long, long time ago in a faraway land was the city of Nineveh. This was a big city with a lot of people living in it. Sadly, these people did not know anything about the living God and His love for them. Their city was full of idols and they worshiped them. These people also did a lot of bad things.

There was a man named Jonah. He was a prophet who spoke God's word. God spoke to him one day. God told Jonah to go to that big, bad city of Nineveh and warn the people in that city to stop worshipping idols and doing bad things or else God would destroy that city.

Guess what happened? Jonah did not want to obey God and follow God's plan. Instead of going to Nineveh, Jonah tried to run away from God. Do you think anyone can run away from God? Could any of us run away from God? He found a ship going to another country far away. He paid the fare and got on the boat. He was going to run away from God. Oh, be careful, little feet where you go! God saw what Jonah was doing. Remember, God sees everything you and I do.

God saw what Jonah was doing and God sent a strong, strong wind into the sea. There was a great storm. The winds roared and the waves of the sea were very high. These waves were so high that the ship was being tossed around like a toy. The sailors on this ship were afraid. They began praying to their idols for help.
