SUBJECT: The Wise Man and the Foolish Man **SCRIPTURE:** Matthew 7:24-27; Luke 6:47-49

AIM: To show the children that the Lord is the one who can keep them in difficulties.

MEMORY VERSE: Psalm 89:26b "... You are My Father, My God and the rock of my

salvation."

REVIEW: Do you remember what we call the stories the Lord told His friends? You know – The stories with a lesson in them? Right! <u>Parables</u> Remember The Runaway Boy (Prodigal Son), The Good Samaritan (The man who help the hurt man), and The Lost Sheep and last time you heard about a sower with seeds. There were different kinds of ground (hearts) where the seed (God's Word) could fall. We want to be like the good ground and have a good heart to take in God's Word

INTRODUCTION: Today's story is something like the one with the seeds only the Lord uses a different picture – a different story.

Bring in a rock and some sand. Make the sand wet and build a house out of the sand or build a house of blocks on the sand. Blow on it and pour water on it to show the children what happens. Do not have to spend too much time on the positive – rock. Just let them see how strong the rock is compared to the sand. Ask the children if they have ever been at the shore and made sand castles? What happened when the waves come?

CONTENT: One day when the Lord Jesus was talking to lots and lots of people on a mountain, He told them that it was important to <u>do</u> what the Lord says and not just to hear His words. He said that whoever would <u>hear</u> His words and do them (obey them) would be like a man that builds a house. This man would put the foundation of the house on the rock. (Show the children pictures of houses in the process of being built, with foundations showing or explain what a foundation is.) This man would be wise (smart) because the rock is very strong – isn't it? When the house was built, it started to rain a lot and wind blew very hard and the flood came. (Like a hurricane maybe) The rain kept coming and the wind kept blowing hard and there was water all around the house and still nothing happened to the house. Everybody inside the house was safe because the house was on the rock. It was very strong and could not be blown away or fall down. This is like everyone who <u>hears</u> and <u>does</u> the Lord's words.

<u>But</u> everyone who only hears what the Lord says and <u>does not do</u> what He says – everyone who does not <u>obey</u> what the Lord says is like a foolish man (a stupid man). A stupid man would build his house on the sand. Even if you put the foundation of the house far down into the sand, it is still foolish. The rain comes, the wind comes and the flood comes and beats against the house. What happen to the house? Right! The sand is washed away and the house falls down – with a big bang! What would happen to the people in the house? They would be hurt badly or even die! Which house would you want?

APPLICATION:

The Lord Jesus says if we listen to Him and obey we are like the man who built his house on the rock. That means the Lord Jesus is the rock. He is strong as a rock!!! If we obey Him, we will be safe. Even if bad things happen to us (e.g. even if we get sick, maybe even have no home, no job, loose a friend, get laughed at etc.) we are like the house on the rock. These are all bad things like wind, rain and flood. If bad things happen to us we can trust the Lord (our rock) and be safe. If the Lord tells us He will never leave us – if something not good happens He wants us not only to hear those words but also obey them – not be afraid. If we only hear what He says and don't do (believe) bad times will knock us down like the foolish man's house. We will be discouraged, afraid, angry, etc. But, we want to have our house on the rock so we can keep standing when hard things come!!

CRAFT IDEA: Paste sand on one side and pebbles on the other side of the page. You can get sand in a craft store or plant store. Find pebbles in the back yard. Have houses cut out that can be pasted on the sand and on the rocks. If you want to be more elaborate you can paste waves and wind. You may just want to copy a stormy scene and paste a house and sand and rock, etc. on that background.
